Intercultural Community Weekend

ICW is an overnight retreat where College Nine students deepen their awareness and connection to College Nine's theme of International and Global Perspectives. Through interactive exercises and small group discussions, students are given the opportunity to learn more about themselves and others, and develop intercultural sensitivity and awareness.

IAG - International Affairs Group

Based out of the International Living Center, the International Affairs Group (IAG) is an opportunity for all College Nine and College Ten community members to engage in lively discussions about important current international issues with one another through guest speakers, film, literature, media, and personal experiences.

Terry Freitas Cafe

Terry Freitas Café was created by students who wanted a chill spot in which they could hang out and build community. Open daily and every night, students can come here to hang out with friends, study for classes, play pool or board games or attend a variety of special programs such as open mics, pool tournaments, or karaoke nights.

Community Garden Class & Club

Colleges Nine and Ten just finished construction of our new garden! The Garden Club meets weekly on Wednesdays in the garden to discuss sustainability issues, integrate the themes of our colleges into the garden design and practice, and work together on soil preparation and planting. Students may also enroll in the 2-unit class in Spring - a hands-on introduction to ecological horticulture.

Praxis - Student Volunteer Community

Praxis is an organization geared toward community building and social justice. By participating in Praxis students gain exposure to a variety of Santa Cruz community agencies and explore what it means to be agents of social change.

Esprit de Corps - CLTE 110 & 110B

Esprit de Corps is a service-learning course for students who are interested in volunteering for credit in the Santa Cruz Community. Volunteers spend time each week in their placements (non-profits and local elementary schools) and meet weekly.

College Nine Student Senate

Student Senate is the College's governing body. It appoints students to campus and college-wide committees, advises College administration on policy development and provides monetary support to student organizations.

14th Annual Practical Activism Conference

The Practical Activism Conference is a daylong, student-led, conference with speakers, organizations, and hands-on activism sessions. The conference is planned by a group of dedicated College Nine, College Ten, and Oakes College students.

Triangle Club

Twice-monthly gatherings and other opportunities for celebrating and strengthening queer community at College Nine and College Ten. Open to all LGBTQ students and allies.

Global Action - CLNI 85

CLNI-85 is College Nine's 2-unit class taught in Winter quarter by students. Explore International Issues in an interactive setting.

Teaching Global Leadership - CLNI 191

Upper-division College Nine students are invited to apply to teach CLNI-85. Student instructors go through training in November and in Winter quarter, they meet weekly with an instructor to explore materials, techniques, and tools to facilitate their own weekly section of 15-20 students for CLNI-85.

GLAD - Global Leadership and Development

Global Leadership and Development (GLAD) meets weekly throughout Fall quarter and provides a wide range of exercises and guest speakers designed to build leadership skills. Students plan and implement a final project for the College Nine community to attend, highlighting an international social justice issue.

CREATE - Cultural Resources to Educate and to Empower

CREATE offers a community/home at College Nine and College Ten for students of color to find support and empowerment through mentorship, friendship, resources and skill-sharing.
